"Becoming" A New Curriculum for Coming of Age for High School Youth at UU Nashua in 2022-2023

Helping our youth shape their own UU identity and embrace the values that will shape their lives.

(We also plan to offer "Neighboring Faiths" year for 5th-8th graders –

we will talk with families of 8^{th} & 9^{th} graders which program they would prefer!)

When:

Sunday afternoons/early evening next Sept-May, gathering twice a month for 1 to 2 hours at UU Nashua.

Who:

High School Aged Youth participating would have an **adult mentor** from the congregation to support and accompany them through the program by attending the sessions as well. Most activities will have groups working together so youth will have a chance to get to know all the amazing adults who can show a variety of ways to be UU and how everyone lives out their values. **Director of Faith Formation Sadie Kahn-Greene** will co-lead with **volunteers** to lead the sessions and when **Rev. Allison** returns from Sabbatical in Dec, she will join sessions as well.

Where else:

We hope to include **extra offsite Faith Exploration activities** that are designed to help youth explore their faith identity in a hands-on way. Some are social justice oriented, and others are adventure oriented. For example, the Faith Exploration activity tied to the lesson about courageous faith suggests a high ropes course followed by spiritual reflection.

What:

The program will also include a youth journal and **end-of-year celebratory worship**. Three of the sessions are devoted to helping youth craft their personal mission/"**north star statement**" (a credo statement).

How:

Unique Components of this new "Becoming" program at UU Nashua 2022-23

The Three Dimensions of the Spiritual Life:

Becoming's theological approach frames the spiritual life around three core themes and questions.

- Belonging To whom or what do I belong?
- Becoming Who am I becoming?
- Beyond What is beyond me?

The Big Questions:

Within these three general areas of the spiritual life, we invite youth to wrestle with more specific questions as they shape their personal religious identity.

For instance, under **Belonging** we invite youth to ask themselves such questions as:

"What values am I committed to?"

"How do I balance my responsibilities to family, friends, society and the faith community to which I belong?"

"How do I resist exclusion and support the belonging of others?"

Questions related to **Becoming**:

"How do I bravely honor my true self?"

"What does it mean to live with authenticity and integrity?"

"What parts from my upbringing do I want to hold onto and let go of?"

Questions related to **Beyond** involve asking:

"What is my relationship to the sacred?"

"Is life random, indifferent, trustworthy, loving, dependable, threatening, cruel, good?"

"What are my responsibilities to needs greater than my own?"

The Five Lenes:

Finally, we use five unique lenses to address all of these "big questions." On their way to answering the question for themselves, youth first explore how they are answered by...

- 1. UUism (our principles, sources and history)
- 2. Pop Culture (music, movies, social norms)
- 3. Life (direct experience of life and faith in action activities)
- 4. Beloved Others (peers, family and mentors)
- 5. Me (What do I think?!)
