### Music Program 2024-2025

The Music Team is doing all the music programming in-person, with a remote option for our music team meetings. We rehearse at 7:30 Wednesday evening and 9:15 Sunday morning. Our Wednesday rehearsals and our team meetings have been held in White Wing at the church, and our worship services have been in the lecture hall at Rivier University. Summer services were held at Temple Beth Abraham.

Team members include co-chairs Kathleen Griffis and Anne Smith, who is also our music librarian, co-secretaries Emma Rearick and Marissa Volpe, Member coordinator Mike Cooper, members Lindsey Hedrick, Brenna Woods, and Kathy Grossman, along with Music Director Jed Holland and Rev. Allison Palm, and they have done a great job in another year of changes.

Jed continues as a year-round employee, so he assisted all the summer service worship leaders as requested, providing keyboard music, solos, and accompaniments as needed.

We have had 29 active choir members this year. We had 1 rejoining choir member Cathy Brodeur and 2 new people (both of whom were new to the church: Steve Blunt & Libby Masek) come to sing with the choir this year.

We currently have four church members (Kim Steele, Rob Bates, Anne Smith, and Kathy Grossman) doing the work of posting recordings to koober.uunashua.org, and have worked to input data correctly for the AV Team to do reporting in accordance with the music licensing requirements.

We provided music each of 42 Sundays of the church year, for a total of 44 choir anthems, 2 Christmas Eve songs (twice), 2 children's choir or songs, and 32 special music performances by soloists or small groups. Faith Formation Director Sadie Kahn-Greene has been facilitating the children's participation.

Since we are worshipping at Rivier University this year, Jed has been using a portable electronic keyboard to provide music this year. We have not been tuning our church piano, which is staying at the church chapel this year. We will return to regular piano tunings by Paul Panek when we return to the sanctuary. Our organ has been removed.

### Goals for 2025-2026

- During this upcoming year our goal will be to provide music for worship services.
- The music team will focus on reintegrating into the renovated church building and helping the congration to feel joyful back in the church.
- To keep personally connected to the individuals in the music program so they feel this church is their family, especially during troubled times.
